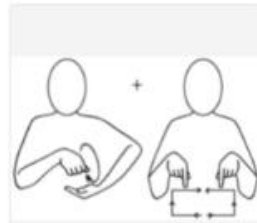

Willow have been learning about the roles of people in the stone age. They have been building a fence with sticks, digging a hole, stacking logs and adventuring around the forest area.



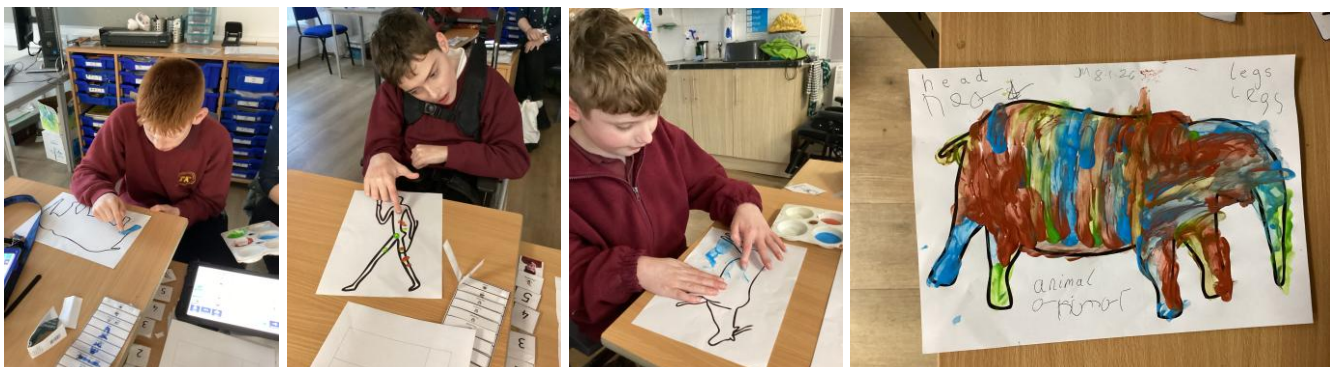
BIRCH CLASS NEWS

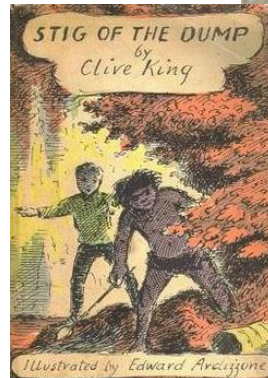




ASH CLASS NEWS

PINE CLASS NEWS

What is it? This session covers:

- What anxiety is, when it is useful, when it becomes unhelpful, and what keeps anxiety going.
- Our body's response to anxiety focusing on our thoughts, feelings, physical sensations and behaviours.
- Providing strategies for managing and overcoming anxiety

Who is it for? Helpful for parents and carers whose children may be struggling with mild anxiety.

When are they? 22nd & 26th January. Sessions will be run at 12pm-1pm and 4pm- 5pm on both dates.

New topics and dates will be released regularly.
