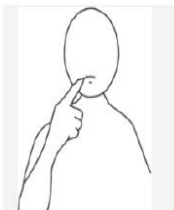

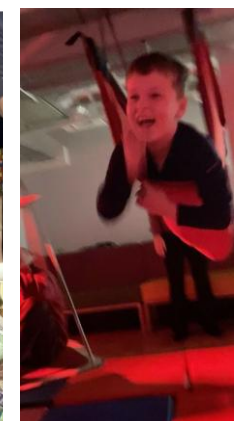
## ROBIN CLASS NEWS

## PRIMARY CULTURE DAY

Primary had an absolutely wonderful time celebrating *Culture Day* — a truly joyful occasion filled with excitement, creativity, and meaningful learning! From the moment the day began, there was a real buzz around the department as the children eagerly immersed themselves in a wide range of hands-on activities, exploring cultures from around the world. The children delighted in making delicious Brazilian *brigadeiro* chocolate balls and let their creativity shine as they painted vibrant lanterns inspired by the Chinese New Year Lantern Festival. It was lovely to see so much enthusiasm, curiosity, and pride in their work throughout the day.

Across the school, classes explored traditions from Polish, Irish, Scottish, Brazilian, Welsh and Traveller communities — we have certainly been busy! A special highlight was learning about the Polish tradition of *Marzanna* — a doll that symbolises the end of winter and the welcome arrival of spring. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring straw as a natural material before carefully designing and decorating their own Marzanna dolls, using fabric and straw to bring their beautiful creations to life. It was especially heartwarming to see our pupils making personal connections to their learning, sharing their own experiences and family links. These moments are so special and truly enrich our school community, helping every child feel seen, valued, and celebrated.
