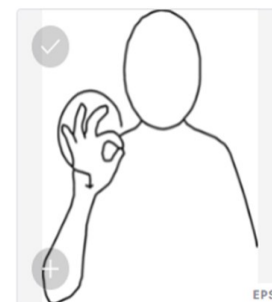
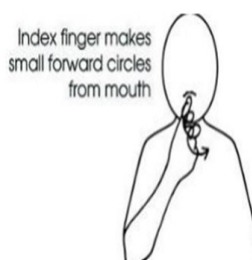

City-Wide Schools Programme Takes Off as Balloon Fiesta Announces Tether Roadshow Shortlist

The Bristol International Balloon Fiesta, in partnership with Albert Goodman has announced the schools shortlisted to participate in the inaugural Schools Tether Roadshow.

Following April's call for applications, where an incredible 400 schools registered their interest, eight schools representing communities from North, East, South and West Bristol have been selected to welcome balloons and their pilots into their grounds.

The eight schools chosen to participate include: St Ursulas E-ACT Academy (Westbury-on-Trym), Knowle Park Primary School (Knowle), Flax Bourton Primary School (Flax Bourton, North Somerset), Fonthill Primary School (Southmead), E-ACT Merchants Academy Primary (Withywood), Glenfrome Primary School (Eastville), The Tynings Primary School (Staple Hill), and Ravenswood School (Nailsea).

Each school has been offered two potential dates for their balloon tether between 1 July and the end of term, with the final date chosen based on weather conditions. If weather prevents a full hot air balloon tether, back up plans are in place using model hot air balloons and in very poor weather a special assembly presentation.

As part of the Fiesta's ongoing community programmes, the Roadshow aims to ignite excitement and curiosity in pupils across the city, providing them with the unique opportunity to experience the magic of hot air ballooning, meet the pilots and their teams and understand the science behind one of Bristol's most iconic heritage sports.

Ben Hardy, executive director, Bristol International Balloon Fiesta, commented: "The Balloon Fiesta is a unique event that has captivated generations of Bristolians, and we're determined to bring the ballooning magic to children throughout the city.

"Bringing balloons directly into school playgrounds not only provides a great learning opportunity but also creates special memories that will last forever. We're looking forward to inspiring the next generation of Fiesta-goers, and maybe even future pilots!"

While only eight schools have been selected to host tethered balloons this summer, every school that applied will receive a special Fiesta Schools Activity Pack, with resources to help teachers bring the magic of ballooning into the classroom and celebrate the city's connection to hot air balloons.

The 2025 Bristol International Balloon Fiesta will take place over three days from Friday 8 to Sunday 10 August in the rolling hills of Ashton Court Estate. The Fiesta will include two Night Glow events, taking place consecutively on Friday and Saturday evening.

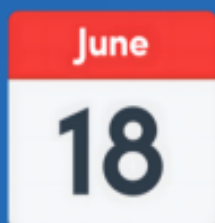
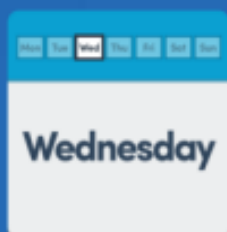


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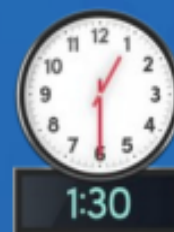
